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Inspired by “Starry Night”

Your one-page reflection/explanation of your work is exactly what it sounds like: one page of writing in which you explain your inspiration and why you created your art/poem or song the way you did. How were you inspired? Why did you use the words or colors that you did? This can be in first person, and does not need/shouldn't have any sources or research. It is all about your inspiration and your reflection on your work. Did your poem turn out like you wanted? Do you like your painting? Once you get writing, it should come pretty easily.
